


The following instructions will help you to install your template.

1. Template Installation

Installing through the Joomla! CMS Extensions Manager:

- In the administration section of your Joomla! web-site go to the **Extensions** → **Extensions Manager**.
- Then in the “**Upload package file**” section open the **Package File** upload dialogue box by clicking on the “**Browse**” button.
- Find the theme .zip archive from the “**joomla**” folder in your downloaded template package, click **Open** and then click “**Upload & install**”.



Manual installation


- Open your downloaded template package and go to the “**joomla**” folder.
- There you’ll see the “**theme###.zip**” package. Extract the files from the package.
- Uploaded the extracted “**theme###**” folder to the “**joomla/templates**” folder on your server.
- Then open the Joomla! Administration panel, go to “**Extensions** → **Extensions Manager** → **Discover**”, then click the “**Discover**” button in the top right corner.
- Below you should see the manually installed template. Select it and click “**Install**” button.



2. Template Activation

When you are done installing the template you need to activate it. Open the Joomla! administration section, then using the main menu please, go to the **“Extensions → Template manager”** page.

Then choose the newly installed template by clicking on the checkbox and click **“Make Default”** button in the upper right corner. This will enable your template as a default one for your site.

Then click on the template name to enter the template configuration page. You need to assign the template to the website pages. To do this click **“Toggle Selection”** button in the **“Menus assignment”** section.

3. Advanced Options

Each template has the advanced options that allow you to modify some template features directly through the admin panel. At the template configuration page take a look at the **“Advanced Options”** section in the right column.

There you can upload your custom logo, insert the website title and description etc.

4. Modules Configuration

Our templates are supplied with the sample pages, modules and configuration settings. In other words to make the template look as at the preview you need to install and configure the modules.

There are two ways to configure the template modules:

- by importing .sql file into the Joomla! database;
- manually configuring template modules through the Joomla! administration panel.

Importing dump.sql file into your Joomla database

ATTENTION: import .sql file ONLY if your site is a clean installation of Joomla! CMS, and you have not yet created any content, articles, modules, etc. This step will erase all the work you've already done to your site. Otherwise, skip this step and read the next one - "Manually configuring template modules"

To install **dump.sql** file you should do the following:

- Open your **PHPMysqlAdmin** tool (which is part of your Hosting Control Panel).
- Select the database you created for the Joomla! CMS.
- Select "**IMPORT**" option and click "**Browse**" button
- Navigate to the "**sources**" folder of the template and select **dump.sql** file.
- Press "**GO**" button. When the import is done, you need to complete only one more step, described in this document - "7. Images Preview"

Manually configuring template modules

- In the Joomla! administration section please, go to "**Extensions → Module Manager**";
- Open each module from the list below, assign it to the given position and set the configuration options from the following table:

- After all the necessary changes are applied save the values of each module by clicking the "**Save & Close**" button in the upper right corner.

To make your Joomla! look like our live demo please, install the database dump that is located in sources\dump.sql.

ATTENTION: By default Joomla! 1.6 installation comes with only the Main Menu module installed. Therefore to make your Joomla! site look like our live demo please, install all necessary

modules through the administration section of your site. You may also need to add all the menu items and articles by yourself.

5. Home page layout

It is necessary to configure the correct front page layout. Open Joomla! administration panel, go to Menus → [menuname]: Home. In the right column check the block **“Layout Options”**. Then please set the layout options as follows:

If a field is left blank, global settings will be used.

7. Images preview

To display the same images as at the template preview, please go to the **“sources/stories”** directory of your template package and copy all the images and folders to the **“images/stories”** directory of your Joomla! installation.

8. How to add new Custom HTML modules to your template

Some templates may contain the custom HTML modules that should be installed manually.

Note: If you performed the dump.sql file import you may skip this step.

Please, enter the Joomla! administration panel, and go to the **Site → Global Configuration**. Find the option **“Default Editor”** and select **“No Editor”**. Default Joomla! WYSIWYG editors may modify the custom HTML module’s code and cause you some issues.

- Then go to the **Extensions → Module Manager** page. Press the **"New"** button in the top right corner:
 - select **"Custom HTML"**;
 - in the **"Title"** field type the title of your new module;
 - in the **"Position"** field choose the correct position for the new module from the Modules Configuration table above (Step 4);
 - in the **"Module Class Suffix"** field please, type the appropriate class suffix specified in the Modules Configuration table;
 - in the **"Custom Output"** text area please, put the HTML code provided in the appropriate file from the template **"sources"** folder. The correct filename could be found in the Modules Configuration table.

After everything is done please, Press the **"Save & Close"** button in the top right corner, and check your website.

9. How to install third party modules

The template may have some modules that are not included into the default Joomla! installation and should be installed manually. The procedure is the same as described in the step 1 of this document.

- From the Joomla! administration panel select **"Extensions → Extensions Manager"**.
- Click the Browse button and select the extension package from the template **"sources"** folder.
- Click the **"Upload & Install"** button.
- Then go to the **"Extensions → Module manager"** page. The newly installed module should appear in the modules list.
- Open the module and set the configuration options according to the Modules Configuration table.

Congratulations, you are done with the template installation. Now you may go to your site and continue with editing.
